

## OSHA 10 - Hour General Industry

<b>Duration</b>	1.5 days
<b>Target group</b>	The OSHA Outreach Training Program for the General Industry teaches construction workers about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint as well as how to identify, abate, avoid, and prevent job related hazards.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	None
<b>Objective</b>	<p>The 10-Hour General OSHA Outreach Training Program is intended to provide entry level general industry workers information about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint as well as how to identify, abate, avoid and prevent job related hazards on a job site.</p> <p>This training covers a variety of general industry safety and health hazards which a worker may encounter at a work site.</p>
<b>Contents</b>	<p>The mandatory (6-hours minimum) topic requirements in this course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Introduction to OSHA</li><li>- Walking and Working Surfaces, including Fall Protection</li><li>- Exit Routes, Emergency Action Plans, Fire Prevention Plans, and Fire Protection</li><li>- Electrical</li><li>- Personal Protective Equipment</li><li>- Hazard Communication</li></ul> <p>The elective (2-hours minimum) topic requirements in this course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Hazardous Materials</li><li>- Materials Handling</li><li>- Machine Guarding</li><li>- Introduction to Industrial Hygiene</li><li>- Bloodborne Pathogens</li><li>- Ergonomics</li><li>- Safety and Health Program</li><li>- Fall Protection</li></ul>
<b>Exam</b>	<p>The candidate will be required to score a minimum competency of 70% on a written exam.</p> <p>To receive a course completion card, the student must attend the entire class and complete all class requirements, including all requisite topics and the minimum number of contact hours.</p>
