

OSHA 30 - Hour General Industry

Duration	4 days
Target group	The purpose of the OSHA Outreach Training Program is to teach workers about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint as well as how to recognize, abate and prevent job-related hazards.
Prerequisites	OSHA 10 General Industry
Objective	<p>The 30-hour General Industry OSHA Outreach Training Program is intended to provide a variety of training to workers with some safety responsibility. Training emphasize hazard identification, avoidance, control and prevention, not OSHA standards.</p> <p>Instructional time must be a minimum of 30 hours.</p>
Contents	<p>The mandatory (12-hours) topic requirements in this course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Introduction to OSHA- Managing Safety and Health- Walking and Working Surfaces, including Fall Protection- Exit Routes, Emergency Action Plans, Fire Prevention Plans, and Fire Protection- Electrical- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)- Materials Handling- Hazard Communication <p>The elective (10-hours minimum) topic requirements in this course are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Hazardous Materials (Flammable and Combustible Liquids, Spray Finishing, Compressed Gases, Dipping and Coating Operations)- Permit-Required Confined Spaces- Lockout / Tagout- Machine Guarding- Welding, Cutting, and Brazing- Introduction to Industrial Hygiene- Bloodborne Pathogens- Ergonomics- Fall Protection- Safety and Health Programs- Powered Industrial Vehicles
Exam	<p>The candidate will be required to score a minimum competency of 70% on a written exam.</p> <p>To receive a course completion card, the student must attend the entire class and complete all class requirements, including all requisite topics and the minimum number of contact hours.</p>
