Target group	The HERTL training course is for personnel who are to be appointed to the role of a Helideck Emergency Response Team Leader.
Prerequisites	<p>Delegates must be in possession of a valid OPITO-approved Helideck Operations Initial Training Certificate (or a valid HDA Initial or a valid HLO Initial training certificates), AND a valid Helideck Emergency Response Team Member (HERTM) certificate or a valid HERTM Further Team Member certificate. AND a valid Radio Operators Certificate of Competence (UKCS Operations only). Delegates must also hold a valid, current offshore medical certificate or possess an operator approved medical certificate. Please note: If a delegate already holds valid HERTM Further, DGBA Awareness and CAA Radio training certificates, there is no requirement to complete the Helideck Operations Initial Training.</p>

Exam

The course is a mix of both practical and theoretical sessions during which delegates will be required to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the course contents. Upon completion of the course, delegates will be awarded with an OPITO-approved Helideck Emergency Response Team Leader (HERTL) certificate. Certification is valid for 2 years. Prior to expiry delegates must undertake the Further HERTL course to remain certified.
