

ERRV Crew Initial Training Shipboard Operations (OPITO)

Duration	5 days
Target group	The ERRV Crew Initial Training Shipboard Operations training is designed for personnel that intend to work onboard an Emergency Response and Rescue Vessel (ERRV). This is excluding Chief Engineers and Masters, as there is no requirement for them to undertake the training.
Prerequisites	There are no prerequisites for this course. However, training activities contained within this course may include physically demanding and potentially stressful elements. All personnel who participate in such activities must be capable of participating fully.
Objective	The aim and objectives of the Initial Training Shipboard Operations training programme are to equip the delegate with the initial knowledge, understanding and skills required to perform the role of ERRV crew.

Exam
