

## IRATA Rope Access Level 3

<b>Duration</b>	5 Days
<b>Target group</b>	<p>IRATA Level 2:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) their current certification is still valid on the day of assessment;</li> <li>b) they have the necessary 1 years' experience and 1000 working hours recorded as level 2 and signed off in their logbook.</li> </ul> <p>or Level 3 Rope Access Technicians:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Revalidation of level 3.</li> </ul>
<b>Prerequisites</b>	<p>Candidates applying to upgrade shall be competent in all practical and theory requirements of their current level prior to attendance of an upgrade course, e.g. an existing Level 1 technician attending a Level 2 course shall be capable of performing all Level 1 syllabus requirements prior to the start of a Level 2 course.</p> <p>Candidates who are not competent at their existing level may require additional Training. As little time is available on upgrade courses for Refresher Training, pre-course evaluation is recommended to verify the Candidates' current level of competence.</p> <p>Candidates seeking to upgrade shall ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) their current certification is still valid on the day of assessment;</li> <li>b) they have the necessary 1 years' experience and 1000 working hours recorded and signed off in their logbook. (to be verified at the beginning of the course)</li> </ul>
<b>Objective</b>	<p>This is an experienced rope access technician who is able to perform more complex tasks under the supervision of a Level 3 Rope Access Safety Supervisor. They are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) able to demonstrate the skills and knowledge required of Level 1;</li> <li>b) capable of more complex rigging, including re-anchors, deviations and tensioned lines;</li> <li>c) able to undertake rescues from a variety of situations;</li> <li>d) able to assemble and implement hauling systems.</li> </ul>

**Exam**

All Candidates are required to undergo a practical Assessment, where they shall demonstrate their competency as per the required 'TACS' [TC-101] syllabus items. Where appropriate, the Assessor may explore the Candidate's knowledge further by discussion. Candidates being assessed for Level 3 certification will additionally be required to sit a Theory Examination. Candidates shall comply with examination and Assessment rules. If a Candidate is in breach of the rules, the Assessment shall be terminated, resulting in a fail.
