## Helideck Emergency Team Member

<b>Duration</b>	2 days
<b>Target group</b>	This course is designed for personnel who are currently appointed or require emergency response training in helideck and helicopter emergencies as part of their overall competence requirement.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	A valid (in date) BOSIET/TBOSIET or FOET/TFOET Certificate
<b>Objective</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•To equip delegates with the knowledge, understanding and skills required to perform an emergency response team member role in offshore helideck and helicopter emergencies.</li> <li>•The main objectives are for delegates to fully understand the role and responsibilities of a Helideck Emergency Response Team Member (HERTM) and practice responding to a variety of helideck fire-fighting and non-firefighting emergency scenarios in a training environment.</li> </ul>
<b>Contents</b>	<p>Delegates who successfully complete this course will acquire the following knowledge and skills:</p> <p>Theory</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•The key role and key responsibilities of the HERTM.</li> <li>•The main elements of helideck emergency response plan. (3) Types of potential offshore helideck emergencies.</li> <li>•The general firefighting safety goals and objectives.</li> <li>•The purpose of typical helideck emergency systems and controls.</li> </ul> <p>Practical</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Emergency access and egress to and from helidecks including clear, concise and effective communications with Helideck Emergency Response Team Member (HERTL) and team members.</li> <li>•Updating HERTL on progress against the emergency response plan at appropriate times.</li> <li>•Responding appropriately to HERTL direction during emergencies including the correct selection of appropriate fire-fighting equipment for the incident.</li> <li>•Under direction from the HERTL: approaching the incident area in a controlled manner continually assessing how the changes in the emergency could impact on the safety of other ERT members, maintaining a means of escape from the incident area.</li> <li>•Effective execution of emergency response tasks.</li> <li>•Correct donning and use of breathing apparatus (BA) when instructed by HERTL (all delegates to practice donning and using BA).</li> <li>•Effective Search and rescue (SAR) principles and techniques – on or close to the helideck, locating, extracting and handling missing personnel and casualties following a helicopter incident on the helideck.</li> <li>•Appropriate response to non-firefighting operations during helicopter incident.</li> <li>•Effective use of firefighting fixed, portable and mobile systems, including fixed fire monitors, dry chemical and Co2 fire extinguishment and control media</li> <li>•Correct casualty handling techniques.</li> <li>•Hose-running techniques and associated hazards</li> </ul>

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**Note:**

All practical exercises require delegates to be fully equipped with firefighting Personal Protective Equipment.

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**Exam**
