<b>Objective</b>	Upon successful completion of all training components, in accordance with the Training Standard, trainees will receive a Workplace NL CSE Certificate that is valid for three (3) years.
<b>Contents</b>	<p>The Newfoundland and Labrador Occupational Health and Safety Regulations, Section 511 (3) states that a person shall not work in a Confined Space unless he or she has completed a Confined Space Entry certification training program prescribed by WorkplaceNL.</p> <p>By the end of the CSE training, participants will be able to demonstrate their understanding of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) The importance of CSE training;</li> <li>b) Legislative roles and responsibilities of workplace parties;</li> <li>c) The Newfoundland and Labrador Occupational Health and Safety Regulations, Part V, General Health and Safety Requirements, section 38 and Part XXVII, Confined Space Entry, sections 511-516;</li> <li>d) Roles and responsibilities of employers in developing CSE programs;</li> <li>e) Roles and responsibilities of persons who are working in Confined Spaces;</li> <li>f) Safety and health hazards of Confined Spaces;</li> <li>g) The recognition, evaluation and control of confined space hazards through the application of hazard assessments;</li> <li>h) Hazardous atmospheres and testing procedures;</li> <li>i) Control methods for hazardous atmospheres; and/or safety and health hazards,</li> <li>j) CSE work permit system;</li> <li>k) The use, care, storage and maintenance of personal protective equipment (PPE) and respiratory protection;</li> <li>l) CSE rescue planning; and</li> <li>m) Incident reporting to the employer and WorkplaceNL, and the basics of investigations.</li> </ul>
