## **Tropical Basic Offshore Safety Induction and Emergency Training (T-BOSIET)**

<b>Duration</b>	3 days
<b>Target group</b>	This training programme is designed to meet the initial offshore safety and emergency response training requirements for personnel new to the offshore oil and gas industry in a tropical environment.
<b>Prerequisites</b>	<p>ITEMS TO BRING: All delegates must bring Photographic I.D. and PASSPORT only (original or copy)</p> <p>HEALTH: All delegates will be asked to complete a medical questionnaire prior to course commencement.</p>
<b>Objective</b>	The aim of the T-BOSIET is to introduce delegates to the specific safety issues and regimes relevant to offshore installations, and to equip them with the basic emergency response knowledge and skills for travelling to and from offshore installations by helicopter in a tropical environment.
<b>Contents</b>	<p>The objectives of the T-BOSIET Training are that delegates will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) Identify the generic hazards, which are specific to offshore oil and gas installations, potential risks associated with those hazards, and how controls are put in place to eliminate or reduce risks.</li><li>(b) Identify key offshore related safety regulations and explain the basic safety management concepts</li><li>(c) Demonstrate, in a simulated environment, that they can use the safety equipment, and follow procedures in preparing for, and during helicopter emergencies – with particular focus on escaping from a helicopter following ditching</li><li>(d) Demonstrate sea survival and first aid techniques</li><li>(e) Demonstrate that they can effectively use basic firefighting equipment, and practice self-rescue techniques in low visibility situations, to include smoke filled areas.</li></ul>
<b>Exam</b>	<p>OPITO approved certification for Tropical Basic Offshore Safety Induction &amp; Emergency Training will be issued on successful completion of the training programme.</p> <p>The validity of the OPITO certificate is four years.</p> <p>Delegates should report to reception for 08.00hrs, course starts at 08.15hrs, unless otherwise stated.</p>
