STCW - Proficiency in Fast Rescue Boats

Duration	2 days
Target group	Crew members on board ships who may function as FRB crew.
Prerequisites	Proficiency in Life boats and survival crafts, other than FRB. The participant must have and bring valid maritime health certificate. Officers, able-bodied seaman and mechanics must bring valid examination certificate. Able-bodied seamen must be able to document 6 month sea going experience.
Objective	To give the delegate the knowledge and skills needed to safely crew an FRB. The course is according to STCW-95, table A-VI/2-2.
