Prerequisites	Proficiency in Life boats and survival crafts, other than FRB. The participant must have and bring valid maritime health certificate. Officers, able-bodied seaman and mechanics must bring valid examination certificate. Ablebodied seamen must be able to document 6 month sea going experience.				
Objective	To give the deligate the knowledge and skills needed to safely crew an FRB. The course is acording to STCW-95, table A-VI/2-2.
